As well as raising awareness, the T-shirts will be raising funds for charity. All profit from every T-shirt sold will be donated to the Orange Shirt Society, along with a matching funds donation by The North West Company.

The North West Company will also recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation by hosting a presentation by a residential school survivor, encouraging staff to reflect and wear orange and lowering flags to half-mast on September 30<sup>th</sup>.

"This is a time for honest conversations and deep reflection," said McConnell. "On September 30<sup>th</sup>, North West will stand among those honouring residential schools survivors, those who did not come home and all those harmed by this dark chapter in our shared history."


